

Welcome to Manchester Cathedral

Welcome to the Cathedral and Collegiate Church of St Mary, St Denys and St George on Christmas Day.

Christians Awake!

The well-known Christmas carol which is sung in our service today has its origins in Manchester. In 1749 John Byrom, a local scholar, wrote a Christmas poem for his daughter, Dolly. The poem became widely known and was set to music by John Wainwright - and it was first sung to the Byrom family outside their home on Hanging Ditch on Christmas Day 1750 by the 'singing men' (the choir of the Collegiate Church). John Wainwright was, at that time, the organist at Stockport Parish Church, and we still sing his tune, *Yorkshire*, today. Later, in 1767, he became the organist here, at the Collegiate Church (before it became a Cathedral).

At one point John Byrom lived in the building that now houses the *Old Wellington* pub, next to the Cathedral. The original of the poem, still bearing the inscription 'Christmas Day – for Dolly', is in Chetham's Library.



In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Holy Communion will be offered in both kinds (i.e. consecrated bread and wine). If you prefer, continuing to receive only bread is also permitted. Please refrain from touching the chalice and consecrated bread must not be intincted (dipped) in the wine.

During the administration of communion, the Choir sings the Agnus Dei and a selection of Christmas anthems.
