Welcome to Manchester Cathedral

Welcome to the Cathedral and Collegiate Church of St Mary, St Denys and St George in the heart of the City of Manchester. The building is the old mediaeval Parish Church of Manchester. King Henry V first granted it Collegiate status in 1421 and it became Manchester's Cathedral on the creation of the Diocese of Manchester in 1847. It is believed that there has been a church on or near this site for over a thousand years.

Trinity Sunday

The Christian calendar developed over centuries. It emphasises two great pivotal foundations of our faith and then the periods in-between celebrating our life in Christ. The first of those emphases is the Incarnation, the coming amongst us of God in Christ. It is the theme of Advent and Christmas and then, in a different way, of Epiphanytide. The second emphasis is the Atonement, Christ's saving work on the cross and then his resurrection – all explored in Lent and Eastertide.

Then comes today, Trinity Sunday, the first Sunday of the long 'green' season which will take us towards All Saints. Trinity is the day when God's full revelation of himself as Trinity is set forth and acclaimed. Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit!



The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

Isaiah 40.12-17, 27-31

A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah:

Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance? Who has directed the spirit of the LORD, or as his counsellor has instructed him? Whom did he consult for his enlightenment, and who taught him the path of justice? Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding? ¹⁵ Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are accounted as dust on the scales; see, he takes up the isles like fine dust. Lebanon would not provide fuel enough, nor are its animals enough for a burnt-offering. All the nations are as nothing before him; they are accounted by him as less than nothing and emptiness.

Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, 'My way is hidden from the LORD, and my right is disregarded by my God'? Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

A year later, Geoffrey commenced his studies at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland in Glasgow. At the same time, he was appointed Assistant Organist at St Mary's Episcopal Cathedral in Glasgow, where he played regularly for the choir and was involved in broadcasts, recordings and many performances while he was there.

After several years as Assistant Organist at Chester Cathedral, he moved to Manchester Cathedral as Sub-Organist in 2015, where he accompanies the Cathedral Choir and directs the Cathedral Voluntary Choir.
